Use the framework to diagnose relationships, not to reduce a country to a slogan.



CULTURE Belonging and obligation can widen public solidarity or narrow duty to private loyalty.	CORRUPTION Private access, favoritism and selective enforcement can displace fair public procedure.
CITIZENSHIP Equal membership gives people standing to ask, participate, object and expect fair treatment.	CONTENTMENT Dignity and resilience sustain people, but should not permanently lower public expectations.
COMPLACENCY Repeated failure can produce a surrender of expectation even among active, informed citizens.	BREAKING THE CYCLE Turn private adaptation into public questions, evidence, consistent standards, collective action and institutional response.
